Single Spinners 39th Anniversary

Single Spinners will be celebrating its 39th anniversary with a large dance in Balboa Park on June 1, 2013. Over the many years our club has danced, we have collected one of the largest collections of decorations of any club in town.

For the last 20 plus years, we have used a wild west (circ 1870). Our club has fabricated posters (thanks to Jane Marus) of an old time town, completed with things like a jail, a school, boarding house, 'House of ill repute', silver mine. Some

It is going to take you a while to get comfortable dancing all of the calls and decreasing you reaction time to them. That is what we will be working on in the club time for the next few months. We will work on increasing your familiarity and ability with the calls, and we will work on building your confidence and timing. We hope to reduce the franticness with which some people dance. Where people can have a straight, but relaxed,

posture and dance the calls smoothly to the beat of the music. That may take time, but it can be done.

Club members: I am counting on you to help in both circumstances. Help the new dancers in their time, and help our new club members make a successful transition. It may require patience, but I think the payoff is worth it over the long term. Remember that when you are helping dancers in a square, let ME do the talking, except for small phrases such as, "here," or "turn around." Have your hand out and available for the new dancer to take. Please try NOT to push or shove people. I have seen that more recently and I hope that does not continue. There may be a time for GENTLE physical guidance, but make sure that other approaches have been exhausted first. Thanks!
