CALLER'S CORNER

Greetings to you all! First off, I want to thank everyone for the tremendous effort demonstrated in putting on our Anniversary dance. I think everyone had a great time. Thanks so much for your help in putting on a great dance! It's hard to believe that 40 years have passed since the formation of the Spinners. It is equally hard to believe that I have been the caller for the club for over half of that time. In January, I will have called for this club for 24 years. Has it really been that long? Additionally, I was distantly involved with the club for nearly a decade previous to that, with my dad going through the class and joining the club in the early 1980's. This kind of longevity is getting more rare in our activity. Let's

make sure it continues for many years to come!

One way to perpetuate longevity in our club, or in any other organization for that matter, is strong, fresh leadership. Speaking in general, over the years I have observed a "catch 22" situation that may develop that can lead to weak or stagnant leadership. Existing leaders may feel comfortable in their positions, or like having that "dangle on their chest" that makes them feel important, or that they just want to hold on to that job. Another possibility is that they feel that no one else wants to take on that job. Please don't misunderstand. There are those who are genuinely dedicated to the activity and freely sign up to take on whatever job is needed -- many thanks to those who do! However, at the same time, those same people should look for someone to take over the position after a period of time to maintain freshness in purpose and mission of the group.

On the other hand, newer members may feel that they are not up to taking any leadership positions. They may feel that there are others who are in those jobs and to just let them continue to do it. They may want to help out, but feel inexperienced, overwhelmed, or intimidated by volunteering for the job. There are also those who are content with just showing up and dancing - and not getting involved with leadership. Ours is a unique activity. It is an activity where the consum

ers of the activity are also the proprietors. There is no Square Dancing Incorporated™ that will run and organize things while we just show up and dance. Our leaders at all levels, club, association, caller, cuer, manufacturer, etc., all come from our activity's consumers. We cannot deny that. If you are in this category, consider increasing your involvement in the leadership of the club. Start small and get comfortable in that role. There are many who can provide help.

Other than the anniversary dance this month, I'm not really doing any extra calling this month – it's vacation time! Of course, now that I have said that, I will be calling for Sundown Squares on the 15th. Please come out an support them if you can. Also, I encourage you to come out to the Fun Dance this month on the 28th. Jimmy Akin and Leo Catt will give you a great time!
